- 1- The effective leader's life is built on the foundation of trustworthiness and self-discipline.
- 2- Dr. Kane's discovery of a local anesthetic demonstrated vision.
- 3- The Babylonians food violated the dietary customs of Daniel's homeland.
- 4- Daniel struggled with a new knowledge that the Babylonians taught polytheism, not just one God, Jehovah.
- 5- Brokenness is demonstrated by allowing your heart to break over a specific need and being motivated to make a difference in meeting that need.
- 6- Establishing godly patterns early in life is important because future decisions depend on our established patterns.
- 7- Character in a leader communicates credibility, creates consistency, and earns trust.
- 8- The lives of those identified in Hebrews 11 showed confidence, dreams, and passion.
- 9- A servant leader is motivated by love to serve others, receives servant ministry from others, and lives a blessed life.
- 10- The example of the farmer and the soil illustrated accountability, diligence, and patience.
- 11- Romans 8: 18-19 contains the path for a life of faithfulness.
- 12- Creativity is a mark of a true leader.
- 13- Interviewing a leader with integrity and monitoring your motives are two steps toward disciplining yourself to be a person of integrity and character.

- 15- The test of forgiveness reveals we are not easily offended.
- 16- The test of small things exposes our attitude and willing submission toward God-given authority.

- 26- To communicate a vision a leader must be an artist, prophet, and lobbyist.
- 27- The servant leader should be loyal to Jesus Christ.
- 28- Broken areas in members' lives must sometime be mended before they can fulfill God's call.

- 30- The purpose of training leadership is to build up the body of Christ.

- 34- Paul commended Timothy for his faithfulness.
- 35- The principle training ground for ministry is the local church.
- 36- Moses' father-in-law advice to Moses was to delegate responsibility to qualified men.
- 37- *Dumping* is giving someone a task you do not want and leaving him/her alone without support.
- 38- According to John Maxwell, the best way to "multiply" your ministry is to lead leaders.

- 42- Credibility is the most important ingredient to good leadership.

- 50- Giving an evangelist a sense of the church's need does not help in creating a mission statement.
- 51- All ministries should help fulfill the mission statement of the church.
- 52- The church mission's statement should be emphasized constantly.
- 53- The church members and staff should form the mission statement.
- 54- A God-given vision is characterized by the leader's obedience.
- 55- God's vision can only be accomplished by the mobilization of the church body using their gifts and talents.
- 56- Communicating and implementing vision requires, among other things, modeling, passion, and repetition over time.
- 57- Everyone in the church should be expected to have as gift of ministry.
- 58- Becoming a larger church is not a biblical reason for training lay leadership.
- 59- The Greek word *katarismos* means "preparing."
- 60- In helping people become active in ministry, a pastor must help them mend the broken areas of their lives.
- 61- Focused principles to follow is necessary for becoming a training and equipping church.
- 62- By delegating and empowering, the pastor is free to focus on God's word and prayer.
- 63- The opposite of an equipping pastor is a nurturing pastor.
- 64- An equipping leader typically creates opportunities to mentor others.
- 65- A church cannot grow beyond its Pastor/leadership.
- 66- Leadership can be taught, but is better developed when it is a combination of learning and gifting.
- 67- Only people who have spent years growing people and organizations attain the leadership level of personhood.
- 68- To develop His disciples, Jesus inspired, instructed and involved.
- 69- A church's most appreciable asset is its people.
- 70- Learning what people cry, dream, and laugh about helps address the principle that people need to be understood.
- 71- True production leadership causes people to follow because of what you have done for them.
- 72- True position leadership causes people to follow because they have to.
- 73- A leader who develops followers causes them to grow inside out.
- 74- A counselor must be an active listener.
- 75- People go the first mile because of duty, but they go the second mile because of relationship is the *second mile principle*.
- 76- Making your words private is not a principle of affirmation.
- 77- The ABCs of relational skills are - attract, believe, and connect.
- 78- The key principle in the story of Mary and Martha in Luke 10 is the priority of sitting at Jesus' feet.

- 80- Growth never comes by team members pursuing separate goals.
- 81- The 80/20 principle teaches us to work smarter.
- 82- When saying "no" to a person, it is important that the leader says "no" to the idea, not the person.
