



HOW TO TAKE	mouth
USES	Antipsychotics - Bipolar Disorder - Tic Disorder Tourette
SIDE EFFECTS	Anaphylaxis - Hypersensitivity rxn - stroke - Aspirations
WARNINGS	stroke - depression - seizures - dystonia

DRUG NAME	Ativan
GENERIC NAME	Lorazepam
DOSAGE RANGE	Tab 5mg - 1mg 2mg Inj. 2mg per ml. 4mg per ml
HOW TO TAKE	mouth or injection
USES	anxiety - insomnia - status epilepticus - nausea vomiting
SIDE EFFECTS	may lead to clinically significant dependence
WARNINGS	concomitant benzodiazepine use w/ opioids may result in profound sedation - resp. depression - coma and death.

GENERIC NAME	fluticasone propionate / salmeterol inhaled
DOSAGE RANGE	1 puff inhaled q12h - 1 puff 250mcg/50mcg per blister
HOW TO TAKE	inhaled
USES	asthma - COPD maintenance - renal dosing - hepatic dosing
SIDE EFFECTS	hypertensive effects - hyperglycemic effects - CYP3A4 substrate
WARNINGS	caution if - glaucoma risk - cataracts - osteoporosis - ocular

GENERIC NAME	Fluticasone propionate nasal
DOSAGE RANGE	2 in each nostril 2 times day up to 4 in each
HOW TO TAKE	Actuations each nostril
USES	corticosteroid for relieving allergic rhinitis symptoms
SIDE EFFECTS	drug interactions - Fluticasone propionate - immunosuppressive effects

HOW TO TAKE	injections - 100pen - 100unit per ml. inj. (U-100) - 100 units
USES	diabetes mellitus type 2 & type 1
SIDE EFFECTS	Hypoglycemia - infection - illness or stress
WARNINGS	caution if visual impaired - renal impairment - hypotension

GENERIC NAME	insulin aspart
DOSAGE RANGE	(pen fill u-100 cartridge) - 100 units - Flex pen u-100 - Vial 100U
HOW TO TAKE	injection subcutaneous
USES	diabetes mellitus

HOW TO TAKE	by mouth as prescribed daily
USES	heart failure - MI acute - migraine headache
SIDE EFFECTS	dizziness - Hypotension - CRT - fatigue - cough - Abdominal p.
WARNINGS	- pregnancy - elderly patients - renal impairment - black
