What does CPRT mean?

When is a CPRT meeting requested?

CPRT meetings can be requested for the following reasons:

- Increase in challenging behaviors
- Current interventions identified for the resident are not working to de-escalate
- Begin discussions of internal transfer or discharge
- Discuss plan/talking points for an external CPRT meeting

Internal CPRT Meeting: Who must attend?

Clinical:

- Beacon Clinician
- CMH Case Manager (if not case managed by Beacon)
- Author of their BTP if they have one

Operations:

- Home Manager
- Assistant Home Manager
- District Director

Medical: Beacon Nurse

Other: CPS worker (if applicable)

Internal CPRT Meeting: Who may be invited?

Clinical:

- Regional Clinical Director (invited if necessary- optional attendee)
- Behavior Analyst within Beacon if Clinical Director has approved

Operations: Regional VP (invited if necessary- optional attendee)

Medical: Nurse Manager (invited if necessary- optional attendee)

What is the purpose of a CPRT meeting?

- Identify additional interventions needed for resident
- Identify any staff training needed
- Prevent discharge
- Reduce crises/emergencies

Roles/Responsibilities in a CPRT meeting

Operations

- HM: provide brief overview of concerning behaviors, impact on home, and interventions tried
- DD: assist HM & identify any licensing concerns
- VP: assist DD/HM & approve next steps when necessary

Roles/Responsibilities in a CPRT meeting

Clinical

- Therapist/CM: identify additional interventions, take notes, enter NextStep note, facilitate meeting
- Behavior Analyst: identify additional interventions & recommend new/changes to token economy or BTP
- Clinical Director: assist therapist/Behavior Analyst & approve next steps when necessary

Roles/Responsibilities in a CPRT meeting

Medical

- Identify any medical issues impacting behavioral concerns

Common CPRT Meeting Outcomes

- Implement/adjust token economy
- Request/adjust BTP
- Request individual and/or group therapy
- Request a medication review
- Identify plan for additional support in home
- Schedule PCP appointment
- Add to watchlist (if not on already)
- Request 1:1 staffing
- Schedule staff training
- Coordinate referral to specialist (i.e., pain clinic)
- Request additional training/mentoring from training department
- Schedule external CPRT meeting
- Consult with Licensing
- Add to transfer/discharge list internally
- Start process for issuing Discharge Notice
