DRUG NAME	Novolog
GENERIC NAME	Insulin aspart
DOSAGE RANGE	INS (penFill U-100 Cartridge) : 100 units per mL ; INS (Flex pen U-100 pen, ETC
HOW TO TAKE	Follow directions on prescription label, injected under the skin
USES	To treat diabetes
SIDE EFFECTS	hypoglycemia, myalgia, rash, URI, weight gain, influenza.
WARNINGS	Never share an injection needle, sharing can infection or disease.

DRUG NAME	Neurontin
GENERIC NAME	gabapentin
DOSAGE RANGE	Cap 100mg, 300mg, 400mg; Tab 600mg, 800mg; SOL: 50 <sup>mg</sup> <sup>per</sup> <sup>ptl</sup>
HOW TO TAKE	Follow all directions on your prescription label take <sup>with</sup> or without food <sup>ptl</sup>
USES	To treat partial seizures, fibromyalgia, alcohol dependence
SIDE EFFECTS	Fatigue, fever, nausea, tremor, vomiting, diarrhea, depression
WARNINGS	in case of emergency wear or carry identification to let others know you have seizures.

DRUG NAME	Prilosec
GENERIC NAME	Omeprazole
DOSAGE RANGE	Dr Cap: 10mg, 20mg, 40mg; Dr Granule: 10mg per pkt
HOW TO TAKE	Follow all directions on your prescription label and read guides
USES	Treat Gastric ulcer, duodenal ulcer, hypersecretory conditions
SIDE EFFECTS	Headache, abdominal pain, nausea, diarrhea, vomiting
WARNINGS	Diarrhea may be a sign of a new infection

DRUG NAME	Lisinopril
GENERIC NAME	Prinivil
DOSAGE RANGE	Tab: 2.5mg, 5mg, 10mg, 20mg, 30mg, 40mg
HOW TO TAKE	
USES	to treat heart failure, MI, acute, migraine headache.
SIDE EFFECTS	Dizziness, hypotension, headache, cough, fatigue.
WARNINGS	Fetal Toxicity

DRUG NAME	NORCO
GENERIC NAME	hydrocodone/acetaminophen
DOSAGE RANGE	Tab: 5mg/325mg, 7.5mg/325mg, 10mg/325mg
HOW TO TAKE	Follow all direction on prescription label, do not take large amount.
USES	to treat pain moderate-mod severe pain
SIDE EFFECTS	Light headadness, dizziness, Sedation, nausea, vomiting
WARNINGS	medication error risk, Addiction, <del>Ab</del> Abuse, Opioid Analgesic
