


The treble or G clef is made with two strokes of the pen in the following manner. The first stroke produces a stylized letter "G" that also looks much like the number 6. The second stroke begins at the top line and produces something that resembles an elongated letter S. Together the two strokes create the treble clef. The final curve of the first stroke surrounds the staff line where the pitch G is found in the treble clef. A professionally typeset treble clef is shown for reference.



1. Draw 10 treble clefs on the staff below.



The bass or F clef is made from a single curve and two dots. Together they create a stylized letter F. The two dots straddle the staff line where the pitch F is found in the bass clef. A professionally typeset bass clef is shown for reference.



2. Draw 10 bass clefs on the staff below.
