Teaching Strategies

Differentiated instruction

Differentiation means to customize instruction to meet individual student needs. Teachers differentiate content, process, products, or the learning environment, ongoing assessment and flexible grouping in order to meet student needs.

Active learning

Teaching strategies that engage students as active participants in their learning environment during class time with the teacher. Typically, these strategies use a bit of students working together during class and involve individual work and/or reflection.

Project-based learning

Project-Based Learning is a strategy where students gain knowledge and skills by working to investigate and respond to an authentic, engaging, and complex question, problem, or challenge.

Inquiry-based learning

Inquiry-based learning is a method that is about teachers creating inquisitive students. Asking questions and creating lessons that provide thought and leaves room for questions.

Blended learning

Blended learning is an approach to education that combines online educational materials and opportunities for interaction online with traditional place-based classroom methods. It requires the physical presence of both teacher and student, with some elements of student control over time, place, path, or pace.

Flipped classrooms

A flipped classroom is an instructional strategy and a type of blended learning focused on student engagement and active learning, giving the instructor a better opportunity to deal with mixed levels, student difficulties, and differentiated learning preferences during the in-class time.

Cooperative learning

When teachers use small groups so that students work together to improve their own and each other's learning experience
