State your name;

Mention your major;

Explain why this source is relevant to your major.

Body of the Oral Presentation:

Provide an annotation of the article in at least 100-150 words using the following requirements:

Identify the author(s);

Mention the **implied** or **explicit audiences**;

Briefly discuss the focused topic of the article(s);

Mention the primary argument made about the topic (Make sure you provide a page number or web address);

Explain the evidence used to support the primary argument (Make sure you provide a page number or web address);

Assess the reliability of the source and discuss whether the source answers the research question of the author(s) and how the source supports your research question and thesis.

Conclusion of Your Oral Presentation:

Recap the main points of your oral presentation and discuss any unexpected insight gained about the topic.

Questions, Comments, Discussion:

Allow for questions, comments, and discussion.
