

In one paragraph each, describe the following and give the Scripture references.

The Holy of Holies was the most inner room of the tabernacle. The room was sacred and only the high priest could enter this room. He had to wash himself completely and change into white garments. He made atonement for the uncleanness of the children of Israel. Leviticus 16:16.

The Holy place was separated from the Holy of Holies it was the outer room where the priest carried on their ministry. There was a curtain (veil) that separated the two rooms. This was where the representative of the people in the priesthood was admitted. Exodus 28:33, and Leviticus 6:16

The table was covered with gold, and it was thirty-six by eighteen by twenty-seven inches and contained rings in its corners so that it, too could be carried on staves. The purpose of the table was to hold the Shewbread, twelve loaves of which were baked every day as a symbol of God's abundance. Exodus 25:23-30

The lampstand was made of seven-branches and held seven oil lamps, one directly in the center and three on either side in a branch like formation. Joints in the branches were made in the shape of flowers, making the whole object ingeniously artistic. The candle stick served not only to give light but to remind the children of Israel that God was the source of the light of revelation. Exodus 25:31-40

Altar of incense was a smaller altar that was located in front of the veil of the Holy Place. It was sheathed over with gold and symbolized prayer. As the smoke of the incense ascended above the veil, Israel was reminded that God was accepting the prayer and the people's needs would be met. Exodus 30:34

Bronze basin was a bowl made completely with bronze. God gave instruction to Moses to make this basin and place it between the tent of meeting and the altar. Water was to be placed in it for Aaron and his sons to wash their hands and feet before entering the tent of meetings. This was done so they wouldn't die when they came to minister and make a burnt offering. Exodus 30:17-20.

Altar for burned offerings was in the court before the tent of meetings where the people that attended the meetings were to bring their sacrifices. The priest then would offer the sacrifices to

God. The altar was made of wood cover with a bronze gate to avert it from set on fire and it was to be  $7\frac{1}{2}$  x  $7\frac{1}{2}$  x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ . Leviticus 1:1-17
