

The End of Time

John Hagee wrote a book entitled, “Four Blood Moons.” Chapter three is entitled, “Warning comes before judgment”. At the of this chapter he uses Jeremiah 6:10 (NASB) which says, “To whom shall I speak and give warning that they may hear? Behold, their ears are closed and they cannot listen.”

(Mary Baxter, p.21) The question is, are you prepared and will you be prepared for the end of time? Today is the time to get prepared.
