In this book, Dauber brings into focus a history of the universe that respects both scientific discovery and the potential presence of an underlying intelligence. His well thought-out accounts of origin of the universe, of terrestrial life, and human intelligence are competent and scholarly. However, I am not fully convinced of his theory that “one day without warning, a comet, or possibly an asteroid, smashed into the Earth, forever changing life on our planet.”
