<p>Cluster A</p> <p>1. Paranoid Personality Disorder</p> <p>2. Schizoid personality Disorder</p> <p>3. Schizotypal Personality Disorder</p>	<p>1. Characterized by a pervasive, persistent and inappropriate mistrust of others. Suspicious of others, trust no one.</p> <p>2. Characterized by primarily by a profound defect in the ability to form personal relationships</p> <p>3. Resembles schizophrenia</p>	<p>Attempt to establish trust</p> <p>Professional demeanor</p> <p>Clear simple explanations</p> <p>Be honest</p> <p>Set limits</p>
<p>Cluster B</p> <p>1. Antisocial Personality</p> <p>2. Borderline personality disorder</p> <p>3. Borderline Personality</p> <p>4. Narcissistic Personality Disorder</p>	<p>1. Fails to sustain consistent employment, fails to conform to law, exploits and manipulates people for personal gain, disregard for others.</p> <p>2. Characterized by a pattern of intense and chaotic relationships with affective instability, highly impulsive, chronic feelings of emptiness</p> <p>3. Emotionally unstable, may dissociate, difficulty controlling anger, self-destructive, high suicide rate.</p> <p>4. Sense of entitlement, lack of empathy, envious of others, use of splitting tantrums</p>	<p>Give positive reinforcement for unselfish or other center behaviors.</p> <p>Keep communications & interactions professional</p> <p>Provide support</p> <p>Help clarify true feelings</p> <p>Assess for suicidal ideation</p>
<p>Cluster C</p> <p>1. Dependent Personality Disorder</p> <p>2. Avoidant Personality Disorder</p> <p>3. Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder</p>	<p>1. Characterized by a pattern of relying on others for emotional support, relatively common within the population. Lack of self confidence</p> <p>2. Extreme sensitivity to rejection, social withdrawal, awkward and comf[y] in social situations</p> <p>3. Characterized by inflexibility about the way in which things must be done, devotion to productivity at the exclusion of personal</p>	<p>Teach and role assertiveness</p> <p>Friendly, gentle reassuring approach</p> <p>Guard against power struggles</p> <p>Provide structure</p> <p>Assist in developing effective coping techniques</p>

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Interventions for all of them:

- Set limits on patient behavior
- All staff should consistently enforce limits
- Assess your own reactions toward the patient
- Have discussions with staff members
- Encourage client to talk abt feelings
- Create therapeutic relationship
