Selected Option/ Result	Therapeutic	Result: Incorrect
Rationale	Speaking with a volume, rate, or tone of voice that conveys negative emotions, such as frustration or anger, is a nontherapeutic communication technique because it can precipitate fear or anger in the client.

Rationale	Reflection is a therapeutic communication technique because it directs questions and feelings back to the client in relation to what the nurse understood and heard, while encouraging the client to explore feelings and ideas about a situation.
