1. What are the clinical manifestations for an ectopic pregnancy?
 - Normal pregnancy symptoms at first
 - Nausea
 - Vomiting
 - Breast Tenderness
 - Missed Period
 - Abdominal pain- dull lower quadrant pain
2. What is a hydatidiform mole (molar pregnancy)
 - Can be complete (fetus never forms) or partial (abnormal fetus)
 - gestational trophoblastic disease, which originates from the placenta and can metastasize
3. What are the manifestation of a molar pregnancy and are there are any complications you should know for follow up care?

s/sx:

 - Vaginal bleeding
 - Nausea & Vomiting
 - Enlarged uterus
 - Preeclampsia

Complications:

 - Choriocarcinoma (cancer, good prognosis, mets) Do a CT scan, pelvic US
 - Sepsis
 - Preeclampsia (HTN)
 - Shock (hypotension)
