### Abnormal/Interrupted Fetal Development

1. What are the clinical manifestations for an ectopic pregnancy?

**Normal sx of pregnancy (n/v, breast tenderness, missed period, etc.), then after the rupture of ectopic pregnancy: acute/severe pain, unstable VS, s/sx of shock (decreased BP, diaphoretic, change in LOC, etc.), dizziness.**

2. What is a hydatidiform mole (molar pregnancy)

**An abnormal rapid growth of Trophoblastic cells, which are type of cells that usually form the placenta. These cells ensure that the fetus does not develop or develops abnormally.**

3. What are the manifestation of a molar pregnancy and are there are any complications you should know for follow up care?

- **Manifestation: Vaginal bleeding, n/v, Enlarged uterus, No Fetal heart tones, Preeclampsia, + hCG**
- **Complications: Choriocarcinoma (type of cancer known in women who have had previous molar pregnancies)**
