

Significant event note:

Pt arrived to ED with SOB and swollen tongue after eating cookies from the neighbor that might have had peanuts in them. Grandmother stated she is allergic tp peanuts and couldn't find her epipen so she brought her in. Upon assessment, lung sounds diminished, SOB, SpO2:92% , HR: 126 , BP: 90/40, RR: 28, c/o feeling dizzy . Notified provider of abnormal results. Administered first round of epinephrine 0.3mg IM. Possible anaphylactic reaction due to peanut allergy and eating cookies possibly containing peanuts. Worsened work of breathing, SpO2: 88, administered O2 4L NC. Notified provider of worsened SOB, expiratory wheezes, and SpO2: 86%. Applied partial non-rebreather mask at 8L. Administered NS 500ml at 999ml/hr. Administer second round of epinephrine 0.3mg IM. Administer diphenhydramine 50mg in 1ml IVP. SpO2: 90%, HR: 128, BP: 110 systolic, less SOB, "I feel better", and lungs clear with no wheezes.
