

### Cancer Screening Recommendations

Cancer	Screening Test (s)	Recommended for whom, what age, how often?
Breast	Mammograms  Breast Ultrasound  Breast MRI  Newer and Experimental Breast Imaging tests	Mammograms: Women between 40 and 44, every year  Breast Ultrasound: For women who have a possible mass found on the mammogram  Breast MRI: Women who at high risk for breast cancer, every year, starting at 30  (Newer and Experimental Breast Imaging test was not listed)
Colon	Liquid Biopsy Stool based test Visual exam	Stool Based exam: For people at average risk, start at 45, every year  Visual exam: For people at average risk, start at 45, every 5 years  Liquid Biopsy: People who needed to start screening before age of 45, and are of high risk for colon cancer, every year
Prostate	PSA Blood Test Digital rectal Exam Prostate Biopsy	PSA Blood Test: Older Males, with regular risk for colon cancer yearly  Digital Rectal Exam: For older males, yearly  Prostate Biopsy: For males who have a high susceptance of prostate cancer, done once
Cervical	HPV Test Pap Test	HPV Test: For people between 25-65, every 5 years  Pap Test: For people between 25-65, every 3 years
Lung	LDCT Chest X-Ray	LDCT: People 50-80 years old who have smoked, yearly  Research has shown that the LDCT scans are more affective than the Chest X-ray, therefore a chest x-ray is no longer recommended.
