Diagnosis/ Problem	Shoulder dystocia Recurrent variable decelerations
Interventions	• Stop oxytocin infusion • Place client in McRobert's position • Apply suprapubic pressure • Call for assistance (Obstetrician, Neonatal team, Anesthesiologist, Additional Staff Nurse/Charge Nurse) • Provide support and education for client, partner, and her parent • Change client position as requested by midwife (hands and knees) • Confirm all interventions and times are documented by self or another nurse • Prepare for emergent cesarean section if shoulder dystocia does not resolve

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
