

# Epilepsy



## Across

- ~~5.~~ Repetitive, rhythmic jerks that involve all or parts of the body
- ~~8.~~ Antiepileptic drug used to control convulsive and nonconvulsive seizures
- ~~9.~~ one half of the cerebrum, the largest part of the brain.
- ~~10.~~ a doctor who specializes in the treatment of epilepsy and other disorders of the brain and nervous system.
- ~~11.~~ Seizure that causes a brief loss of awareness

## Down

- ~~1.~~ Continuous simultaneous recording of brainwaves and video observation of the behavior
- ~~2.~~ the region of the brain responsible for the abnormal electrical signals that cause seizures.
- ~~3.~~ a neuro-surgical procedure to prevent further seizures
- ~~4.~~ surgery to remove isolated brain lesions that are responsible for seizure activity.
- ~~6.~~ a conductive disk (usually metal) attached to the scalp which conveys the electrical activity of the brain through a wire to an EEG machine.
- ~~7.~~ Warning or initial symptom at the beginning of a seizure
