

Hearing Diagnostic Tests	
How are these tests performed? What is considered normal?	
Whisper Test	Weber Test
A basic hearing test that involves an examiner standing behind a patient and softly whispering a mix of letters and numbers. The patient listens and repeats them back. Successfully identifying at least three out of six whispered items indicates normal hearing.	a simple hearing test that uses a tuning fork to determine the type and location of one-sided hearing loss. During the test, the tuning fork is struck and placed at the center of the patient's head, and the patient is asked whether the sound is heard equally in both ears or louder in one. A normal finding is when the sound is heard equally in both ears, indicating balanced hearing without significant conductive or sensorineural hearing loss.

- What is the correct way to instill eardrops?: It must be room temperature, the client must be laid on their unaffected side, the ear canal is straightened and then finally instilled where the client will stay on their side for 2-10 minutes.



- What are signs & symptoms of Meniere's Disease? How is it treated?
 - Signs and symptoms include vertigo, fluctuating hearing loss, tinnitus, and a sensation of fullness in the ear. Treatment includes medications, lifestyle changes like reducing salt, vestibular therapy, hearing aids, and in severe cases, surgical procedures.
