4. Why did Mandy talk with Richard (assistive personnel) about the vital signs not being within reference range for Ms. Kelly?

It's important to notify abnormal vitals signs r/t a change in pt's care.

- a. What elements of professionalism did Mandy demonstrate regarding the reevaluation of Ms. Kelly's vital signs?

Accountability, responsibility, and autonomy. Any change in a pt's status is critical to follow up on and it's your job as a nurse to do so.

5. What provisions within the Code of Ethics did Mandy demonstrate when communicating with Richard?

4: accountable to your own actions, including delegating care. If not done, it is your responsibility to get it done & give quality care.

6. What behaviors are essential to demonstrate professionalism?

-Human responses: individual or potential health problems response  
-theory application: understanding/implementing EBP theory  
-nursing actions: EBP interventions to protect/promote people  
-outcomes: benefits to the pt

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7. What is the purpose of attending continuing education in nursing?

To renew license: to make sure you are informed about new EBPs in nursing to be able to provide the best care to your patient and that it is quality-based.

8. Is it essential for a nurse to continually attend formal nursing education?

Yes, it is to renew your license, even if it is only CEUs, although most hospitals are requiring BSNs. This was shown because having your BSN has better pt outcomes and lower mortality rates.
