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1. What characteristics of a professional nurse did Mandy demonstrate when asked to attend a hospital committee meeting on a day off?

She demonstrated commitment to her job and providing a service, plus responsibility to not only herself, but to others around her for being present.

2. What is the purpose of the ANA Code of Ethics?

Sets the ethical standards of nursing. Provides guidance regarding legal and ethical responsibilities to clients and society

3. What provisions within the Code of Ethics did Mandy demonstrate?

Mandy demonstrated 2: primary commitment to client by focusing her job on the client and their needs. This involved checking the chart and vital signs for the patient.

4. Why did Mandy talk with Richard (assistive personnel) about the vital signs not being within reference range for Ms. Kelly? It is Mandy's duty to be responsible for her patients and to care for them all around even if she delegated. She still needs to care and provide service to her patients to prevent decline. It also helps Richard's learning on when to notify for any concerns or abnormalities for a patient

- a. What elements of professionalism did Mandy demonstrate regarding the reevaluation of Ms. Kelly's vital signs? Elements of professionalism that Mandy demonstrated was knowledge for the rolls performed. Without her knowledge of abnormal vital signs and to recheck them, she may have moved on. This allowed

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for her to double check on the patient and be held accountable if any severe events took place.

5. What provisions within the Code of Ethics did Mandy demonstrate when communicating with Richard?

3, client advocate. Mandy was making sure the patient was okay and taking initiative for the vital signs that were not in normal range. This show putting the patients best interests first

6. What behaviors are essential to demonstrate professionalism?
Behaviors that are essential to demonstrate professionalism in nursing is accountability, responsibility and autonomy. Nursing also requires ethical practice in their behavior to uphold the commitment between society and their patients.
