

Cancer Screening Recommendations

Cancer	Screening Test (s)	Recommended for whom, what age, how often?
Breast	Mammography, ultrasound, MRI, and Biopsy	Woman ages 40 – 74 years old every 2 years
Colon	Colonoscopy, fecal immunochemical test, and multi-target stool DNA test	Behind at age 45 for average risk individuals if results are normal people can wait 10 years until the next screening.
Prostate	Prostate Specific Antigen PSA test, Digital Rectal Exam, and biopsy	40 years old for high risk individuals, and 50 years old for average risk. They should be screened yearly or every two years if doctor determine regular screening necessary.
Cervical	Pap test or a HPV test.	21 – 29 years old should be screened every 3 years. 30 – 65 should be screened every 5 years if they are getting the HPV and Pap or the HPV alone. If they are are just getting Pap, then every 3 years.
Lung	Low does computed tomography scan	Current or former smokers should do this test and people between the ages 50 – 80 years old. Should be screened annually.
