

Cancer Screening Recommendations

Cancer	Screening Test (s)	Recommended for whom, what age, how often?
Breast	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Mammograms - Breast ultra sounds - Breast MRI - Newer and experimental breast imaging test 	<p>316,950 new cases of breast cancer in women a year, median age is 62, 1 in every 3 women might have breast cancer in their lifetime</p> <p>2,800 new cases of breast cancer a year for men, is about 100 times less common in white men compared to white females, 1 in every 726 males may have breast cancer in their lifetime</p>
Colon	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Stool based test - Visual exams - Blood based tests 	<p>54,510 cases for men and 52,810 cases in women</p> <p>In people 55 or under, deaths have increased by 2% a year</p> <p>1 in every 24 men may develop colon cancer and for women, 1 in 26 may develop colon cancer</p>
Prostate	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Prostate specific antigen blood test - Digital rectal exam - 	<p>Men is where prostate cancer appears, 313,780 new cases of prostate cancer expected in 2025</p> <p>1 out of 8 men are likely to develop prostate cancer</p> <p>About 6 in 10 men will develop this cancer after the age of 65 and is rare in men under the age of 40</p>
Cervical	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Colonoscopy - Cervical biopsy - Imaging studies (x-ray, MRI) 	<p>Occurs in women, 13,360 new cases expected this year</p> <p>Average age is between 33 and 45 and the average age is 50</p> <p>Rarely develops in women under the age of 20</p>
Lung	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -chest x-ray - ct scan - MRI 	<p>About 119,680 new cases of lung cancer this year for men and 115,970 new cases of lung cancer this year for women</p> <p>Diagnosed in people 65 or older in most cases, 1 in 17 men may develop this cancer in their lifetime and 1 in 18 for women</p>
