1. Which over-the-counter medication is **contraindicated** in Probenecid use?

Answer: ~~aspirin~~ aspirin

2. A client with an acute attack of gout is treated with **Colchicine** to improve joint pain

3. Which medications **interfere** with Allopurinol?

Answer: anticoagulants

→ decreased serum  
and urinary  
acid levels

4. Patients on **Adalimumab** must be able to perform subcutaneous injections

anti-inflammatory ↑  
RA decrease pain and swelling

5. When should **Indomethacin** be administered?

Answer: immediately after meals

6. **Methotrexate** can result in what complication?

Answer: immunosuppression

↓ joint pain + swelling improve mobility  
in RA

7. When should patients take **Alendronate**?

Answer: empty stomach

treat osteoporosis

8. **Celecoxib** complications include black, tarry stools \*

OA

9. To prevent kidney damage, patients taking <sup>same as</sup> **Methotrexate** must drink avoid dehydration

10. <sup>improve S/S of RA</sup> **Hydroxychloroquine** can cause photosensitivity

11. An allergy to what food affects the safety of **Glucosamine** administration?  
<sup>decrease pain and improve joint function</sup>  
Answer: shellfish

12. High doses of **Calcium supplements** may cause what complication?  
Answer: kidney stones

13. What is a symptom of salicylate toxicity?  
<sup>aspirin poisoning</sup>  
tinnitus (ringing in ears)
