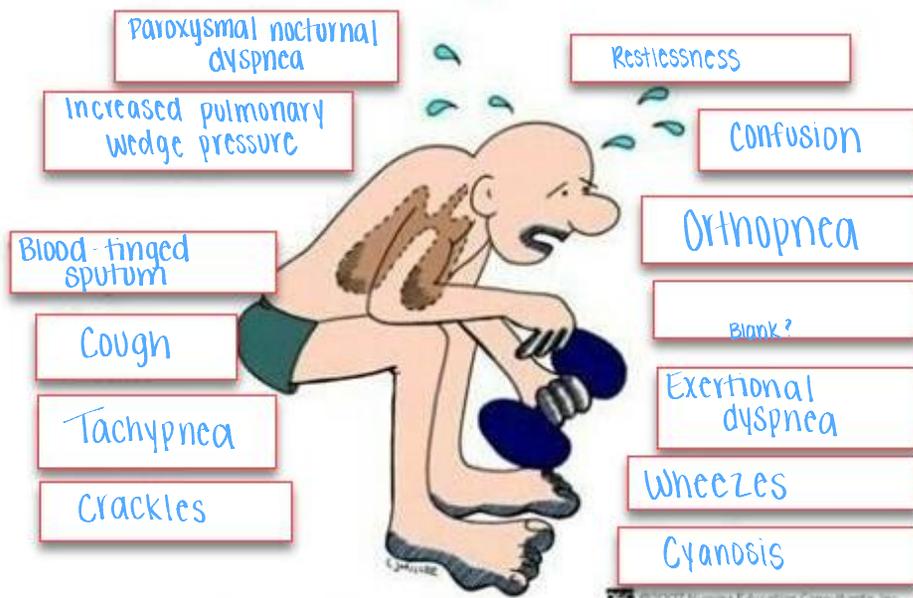


## Heart Failure Review

Instructions: Complete the diagram by labeling each symptom appropriately to either right or left sided heart failure

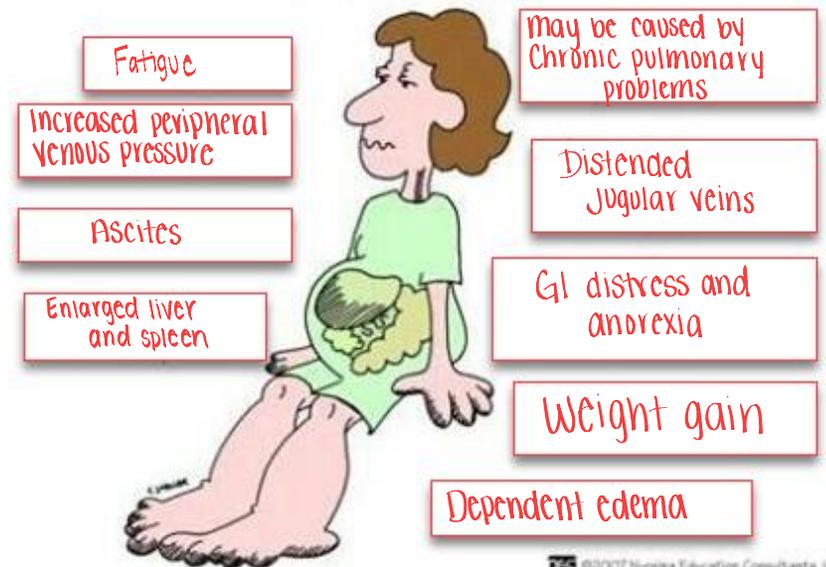
<del>Fatigue</del>	<u>Orthopnea</u>	<del>GI Distress/Anorexia</del>	<u>Confusion</u>

<del>Enlarged liver &amp; spleen</del>	<u>Tachypnea</u>	<del>Paroxysmal Nocturnal Dyspnea</del>	<u>Crackles/Wheezes</u>
<del>Restlessness</del>	<del>Dependent edema</del>	<u>↑ peripheral venous pressure</u>	<del>Exertional dyspnea</del>
<u>↑ pulm cap wedge pressure</u>	<del>Cough</del>	<u>Blood tinged sputum</u>	<del>May be caused by chronic pulm problems</del>
