↑ <u>pulm</u> cap wedge pressure	Cough	Blood tinged sputum	May be caused by chronic <u>pulm</u> problems




### LEFT SIDED ♥ FAILURE




### RIGHT SIDED ♥ FAILURE

(Cor Pulmonale)



Label the coronary arteries on the diagram below. For the bolded arteries, state what portion of the heart they feed.

- Left Anterior Descending (LAD)
- **Right Coronary Artery**
- Left Coronary Artery
- **Left Circumflex**
- Aorta



-The right coronary artery feeds the right atrium, right ventricle, SA node, AV node, inferior wall of the left ventricle.

-The left circumflex feeds the wall of the left ventricle and the left atrium.

-The left anterior descending artery feeds the anterior wall of the left ventricle, anterior 2/3 of the intraventricular septum, and the apex of the heart.
