1. Evidence- Stalk damage- Deposits
  - a. Chewing
  - b. Young part of the plant
  - c. New leaves
  - d. Army cutworm
2. If there are brown deposits and chew marks on leaves and stalks then you can assume it is an Amy cutworm.
  - a. They have a tendency to leave brown deposits
  - b. They attack the young, tender parts of the corn plant
  - c. They will chew from the edge to the center not just the center of the leaf.
  - d. Crime Scene: Damage may consist of damage to the leaves. Damage consists primarily of stripping of the leaves. Larvae may feed on the ear causing injury.
