

Activity 5.1.1 Matching Note Cards

Directions: Print the following table on cardstock and cut each cell apart.

Ruminant	Animal with a four-chambered stomach, consumes large quantities of roughage
Digestion	The breaking down of food into simple substances that is more readily available to the body for use.
Monogastric	Simple stomached animals (pigs, horse)
Rumen	Largest part of the ruminant digestive system. Solid material goes here.
Reticulum	Liquid goes here in ruminant animals
Omasum	Grinds and squeezes food
Abomasum	The true stomach of a ruminant animal, majority of digestion occurs here.

Cecum	Bacterial digestion occurs here in horses.
Avian	Another term for poultry
Stomach	Receives feed and adds chemicals that aid in digestion
Small intestine	Long folded tube attached to the lower end of the stomach
Large intestine	Large diameter tube, shorter in length, ending at rectum
Mouth	Point where food enters the body
Esophagus	Tube-like passage from mouth to stomach
Rectum	The terminal end of the intestine, ending at the anus
