On January 13, 2013, You did not verify the last dose of pain medication on the eMAR and ended up giving the patient another round of medication that the patient had just gotten. You had also failed to notify the charge nurse and physician that she did not verify the last dose of medication on the eMAR. You then falsely documented in the Pyxis that she wasted the pain medication that she had already given the patient. She also reported in the eMAR that the pain medicine was not given.

If You would checked the eMAR before giving the patient the medicine the patient would not have been at risk for an adverse drug reaction or possibly even a drug overdose. Then even if for some reason she still missed that the patient was already given the drug then she should have notified to charge nurse and physician so they could monitor the patient and make sure that they were going to be okay or take extra measurements if needed. If You would not have also said she wasted the medicine when she actually gave it to the patient then it might would not have been as “bad” because she would not have been trying to cover her tracks.
