Date action was taken against the license: December 12, 2017

Type of action taken against the license: Revoked

Charge 1 - **1/25/2012** – False documentation

Adonica falsely documented that she administered Flagyl to a patient but there wasn't a medication withdraw from the medication dispensing system associated with the documented time of administration.

Charge 2 – **1/25/2012** – Medication error

Adonica failed to administer Flexeril to a patient as ordered by the physician. She documented administration at 1104 when the order was for 2100.

**8/6/2013 – License number 544992 is Revoked.**

**4/7/2015** Adonica petitions for Reinstatement.

**5/28/2015 – License number 544992 is reinstated** following a signed Reinstatement agreed order and emails from previous co-workers in support of her petition.

Charge 1 - **4/24/2017** – Illegal drug use

Adonica is seeking employment with Maxim Healthcare Services and fails a pre-employment drug screen. She tested positive for Marijuana and Cocaine.

**December 12, 2017 License number 544992 is Revoked.**

In my opinion, Adonica should have been subjected to a drug screen after her false documentation and medication error on 1/25/2012 to see if she was under the influence while on the job. If she was then they could have subjected her to the TPAPN program.

I think a prudent nurse would have stopped Adonica from administering Flexeril to her patient at the wrong time and checked to see if she was feeling okay and then given the charge nurse or nurse manager a heads up so that everyone was aware and could either keep an eye on her or get a drug test ordered. If a prudent nurse were to discover Adonicas' med error after it occurred then the nurse would have notified the nurse manager and patient physician immediately after she assessed the patient.
