Discontinue the medication gradually to minimize the frequency of seizures 2. Assess for CNS adverse effects 3. Monitor RBC count and LFT as it can cause decreased RBCs and affect liver function 4. Teach pt to notify HCP if unusual behavioral changes or skin rashes occur

Dizziness, pounding in ears, nervousness, irritation at patch site	1. Teach patient to avoid doing activities that require mental alertness until patient-specific side effects of the medication are known 2. Monitor the patient's blood sugar closely if they have diabetes 3. Advise patient that burning and irritation at the patch site will subside in an hour 4. Assess patient for s/s of overdose, such as N/V, headache, hypotension, and

Irregular heartbeat, bruising, abnormal bleeding	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Advise patient to avoid alcohol to decrease risk of gastric irritation 2. Advise patient to tell HCP about aspirin use prior to surgery - may need to stop taking temporarily 3. Monitor platelet count and hematocrit 4. Administer with food or after meals to avoid gastric irritation
Carvedilol	Beta-adrenergic blocking agent	Treats hypertension, angina, heart failure	12.5 mg PO BID	<input type="text"/> Yes	N/A	Hyperglycemia, hypotension, weight gain	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Monitor for evidence of fluid overload (weight gain, edema) 2. Monitor for signs of toxicity (bradycardia, severe dizziness, dyspnea, bluish fingernails or palms, and seizures) 3. Teach patient that abrupt withdrawal may cause life-threatening arrhythmias, HTN, or MI 4. Teach patient to check pulse and BP biweekly - if pulse is <50 or if BP has significantly changed, contact HCP
