Charge 1 – **7/2/2016** – Diverting drugs

John was seen on video surveillance diverting bottles of Propofol 1000 mg/mL while off duty.

**7/4/2016**

John was again seen on video surveillance diverting bottles of propofol 1000 mg/mL while on duty. He accessed the Pyxis system and cancelled the removal of IV Tylenol and surveillance showed him opening the med drawer and removing a substance. It was determined that bottles of Propofol were missing from that drawer after the cancelled transactions.

**December 12, 2017 License number 819246 is Revoked.**

In my opinion, I believe Johns' license was rightfully revoked. He stole from the hospital off duty and then repeated his actions while on duty just two days later. John was going to do what he wanted, I don't think there was anything that could've been done to prevent his actions.

A prudent nurse would report a nurse diverting drugs to the Nurse Manager immediately, whether it was physically seeing the diversion in action or just hearing of a nurse diverting drugs. It is a big deal that effects patients, the staff, and the hospital.
