On April 19, 2013 a student came in for their medication. Reman administered 800 mg of Renvela through the students peritoneal dialysis port instead of through the gastrostomy tube. This mistake sent the student to the ER later that night where they to get the peritoneal dialysis port flushed so they could regain vascular function. Then 2 days later he was hospitalized again and was treated for 4 days for peritonitis.**

She should have also clarified with the student of where the medication goes in.
