Kaitlyn Patrick, Heather Zamarripa, Laura Contreras, Alyssa Gonzales:

Young parents with three children who are low socioeconomic status that are having difficulty making ends meet. One of their biggest expenses is food. They would like information on the following (need to select **four agencies/schools/churches** that would be helpful for them for your presentation):

- How to apply for food stamps or food vouchers (SNAP)
- What agencies give food boxes or have food pantries and do you need vouchers? What do you need if not vouchers? (South Plains Food Bank, WIC, multiple churches)
- What agencies/churches/soup kitchens serve free meals? What days/times/meals? (Open Door, Second Helpings at First United Methodist Church, Lubbock Impact, St. Benedict, Fiesta Domingo, etc.).
- How do they apply for free lunches at school?
- Are there after-school snack packs for their children and how do they get them? (Food2Kids, YWCA)

Sierra Manhoff, Jacqueline Perez, Elizabeth Velez, Jessica Cuevas:

Hispanic low socioeconomic status teenage parents with infant twins that need to complete high school or get a GED so that they can work. They are currently staying with the father's parents but need to move out soon because of limited space. They would like information on the following (need to select **four agencies/schools/churches** that would be helpful for them for your presentation):

- Who offers GED classes? (Matthew's Alternative School, Lubbock Dream Center, Literacy Lubbock, Goodwill Industries, etc.)
- What do alternative schools offer in LISD and Frenship ISD?
- What other education classes might be helpful to them, i.e., computer classes, English Second Language classes, literacy classes, etc.
- Where can they get information on low income housing? (Lubbock Housing Authority)
- Who could help them with utilities? (Catholic Family Services)
- What are agencies that could help them with interviewing skills and employment? (WorkForce Solutions Career Services, Trinity Outreach Center & Storehouse, Texas Department of Health & Human Services, etc.).

Foster parents who have recently taken two school-age children (a brother and sister) due to CPS mandating that they be removed from their home due to child abuse and possible sexual abuse. The foster parents need information on local agencies that work with children who have been abused.
