

1. Why is Sidelying position better for feeding preterm infants? **Side lying has better regulation control of feeding. It is safer for the baby. You can place your hand on the back and feel how the baby is breathing and their respirations. The trunk is elongated position and not flexed up with pressure on the abdomen which causes reflux.**
2. What are some indications for feeding tube placement discussed in the video? **Prematurity, feeding immaturity, poor oro motor skills, infants w/respiratory distress w/tachypnea, and infants receiving assisted ventilation.**
3. How long before the cord stump falls off? **In one to three week the stump will dry up and fall off.**
