

Respiratory (chest configuration, breath sounds, rate, rhythm, depth, pattern)
 Bilateral chest rising. Signs of labored breathing presented with usage of accessory muscles. Patient on room air with current Sats at 85%. During auscultation, lungs sound diminished on all areas.

Cardiovascular (heart sounds, apical and radial rate, rhythm, radial and pedal pulse, pattern)
 Bilateral radial pulses are strong, while pedal pulses are weak. Heart sounds are tachycardic. Skin turgor assessed on clavicular area and within normal limits. Some dependent edema on lower extremities.

EENT (symmetry, drainage of eyes, ears, nose, throat, mouth, including dentition, nodes, and swallowing)
 Unable to assess eyes. Patient mouth swollen due to brain edema. Unable to assess.

 Husband at bedside in the AM. Unable to interact with family and staff.
