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							extremity pain, nasopharyngitis 4. Advise patient that there are multiple significant drug-drug interactions for this drug.

Advise patient that drug may increase risk for osteoporosis-related fractures of the hip, wrist or spine 2. Warn patient to report diarrhea that does not improve, especially with persistent watery stools, fever, and abdominal pain 3. Tell patients to report s/s of hypomagnesemia (dizziness, palpitations, seizures) 4. Counsel patient to report symptoms of cutaneous or systemic lupus erythematosus

Advise patient that symptomatic improvement may not be seen for a few weeks. 3. Instruct patient to report worsening depression, suicidal ideation, or unusual changes in behaviors 4. Advise patient against sudden discontinuation of drug, as this may cause dysphoric mood, irritability, agitation, confusion.
