Inform patients with diabetes that acetaminophen may alter results of blood glucose monitoring. 3. Assess type, location, and intensity prior to and 30 minutes following administration 4. Discontinue therapy if rash (reddening of skin, blisters, and skin peeling) occurs

Blurred vision, n/v/d, drowsiness, sleep walking, dizziness	1. Contraindicated in: severe hepatic impairment (increases risk of hepatic encephalopathy) 2. May cause daytime drowsiness or dizziness. Advise pt to avoid activities requiring alertness until response to this medication is known 3. Use cautiously in: pulmonary disease

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							4. Before administratering, reduce external stimuli and provide comfort measures to increase effectiveness of medication

PTs who have asthma, aspirin-induced allergy, and nasal polps are at increased risk for developing hypersensitivity reactions. Monitor pt. 2. Advise pt to take this medication with a full glass of water and to remain upright position for 15-30minutes after administration 3. Use cautiously in: severe renal or hepatic impairment 4. Contraindicated in: cross-sensitivity may occur with other NSAIDs, including aspirin
