Aspirin chew	Salicylate	Reduces fever and inflammation	81 mg PO Q24H	Correct dose	NA	Heart burn, epigastric discomfort, indigestion, constipation, black/tarry stool,	1. Do not crush (EC) 2. Report ringing in the ears 3. Watch for easier bleeding at injured sites 4. Report GI upset
Acetaminophen	Analgesics Antipyretic	Pain reliever Fever reducer	500 mg po prn	Correct dose	NA	Fatigue, GI upset, increased bleeding	1. Avoid alcohol 2. Do not exceed 4 grams a day 3. Evaluate liver enzymes- risk of liver toxicity 4. Teach pt signs and symptoms of renal impairment

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Pantoprazole	Proton pump inhibitor	Suppresses gastric acid secretion	20 mg EC tab po with breakfast	Correct dose	NA	Nausea, diarrhea, headache, flatulence	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Avoid scheduled use for over 8 weeks in older adults because it can cause C diff. 2. Teach patient to report diarrhea that does not improve 3. Do not split, crush or chew the medication 4. Monitor for symptoms of unresolved GERD
Amitriptyline	Antidepressant, tricyclic	Blocking membrane pump mechanisms which is responsible for the absorption of serotonin and norepinephrine	25 mg po bid	Correct dose	NA	Weight gain, constipation, xerostomia, dizziness, headache, somnolence, blurred vision	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Report use of an MAO inhibitor within 14 days prior to starting this drug 2. Report weight gain, bloating, orthostatic hypotension, and syncope 3. Teach patient to report worsening depression or suicidal thoughts asap 4. Do not drink alcohol while taking this medication

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Atorvastatin	Antihyperlipidemic	Inhibits production of a sterol and cholesterol precursor	40 mg po QHS	Correct dose	NA	Diarrhea, arthralgia, myalgia, urinary tract infection disease	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Teach patient to report signs/symptoms of myopathy or rhabdomyolysis 2. Monitor lipid levels 3. Report signs/symptoms of liver injury-jaundice 4. Avoid alcohol due to risk for liver toxicity
Promethazine	Antihistamine	Blocks histamine receptors	12.5 mg po QHS	Correct dose	NA	Dermatitis, phototoxicity, urticaria, n/v, cns depression, dizziness	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Avoid exposure to sunlight without sunscreen 2. Watch for respiratory depression or excessive sedation 3. Avoid drinking alcohol 4. Report n/v, and dizziness
Atenolol	Beta adrenergic blocker	Hypertension management	25 mg po daily	Correct dose	NA	Bradycardia, hypotension, dizziness, depression, fatigue,	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. BBW: never stop taking this medication abruptly 2. Monitor BP 3. Report lightheadedness and syncope 4. Teach patient to report signs/symptoms of cardiac failure

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Lisinopril	ACE inhibitor	Decreased vasopressor activity	3 10mg tabs po daily	Correct dose	NA	Chest pain, hypotension, syncope, dizziness, headache, cough	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Watch for angioedema 1of the face, lips, throat, or intestines 2. Report signs/symptoms of a persistent cough 3. Monitor BP 4. never discontinue this drug abruptly
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
