Prompt and accurate serum lithium should be available 2. Advise pt to report unexplained syncope 3. Advise pt to maintain adequate fluid and salt intake and a normal diet. 4. Monitor serum lithium. (0.8-1.5 mEq/L)
fentanyl	Opioid	analgesic	Via PCA pump at 10 mcg/hour lockout q 15 minutes			Pruritus, rash, constipation, anemia, asthenia, confusion, insomnia	1. BBW: serious life-threatening respiratory depression has occurred. 2. Instruct pt to report s/s of resp. distress 3. teach pt to avoid alcohol or other CNS depressants 4. monitor pain intensity
risperidone	antipsychotic	Bipolar disorder	2 mg po qd			Hyperprolactinemia, constipation, excessive salivation	1. BBW: caution in elderly pt with dementia 2. advise pt to change positions slowly 3. tell pt to report s/s of EPS, TD, and NMS 4. monitor improvement bipolar disorder

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lorazepam	benzodiazepine	antianxiety	2 mg po q 8 hours prn agitation	<input style="width: 100px; height: 20px;" type="text"/>		Asthenia, dizziness, sedated, unsteadiness present, depression	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. BBW: concomitant use of benzodiazepines and opioids may result in profound sedation 2. warn pt to avoid pregnancy during treatment 3. advise pt against sudden discontinuation 4. advise pt to avoid alcohol
vancomycin	Glycopeptide	Antibiotic	1 gm IVPB in 200 mL 0.9% NS; infuse over 60 minutes	<input style="width: 100px; height: 20px;" type="text"/>	nL NS infuse over 60 minutes	Hypokalemia, abdominal pain, diarrhea, nausea, vomiting	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. monitor CBC with differential 2. teach pt this is to treat infection 3. assess input/output to monitor renal function 4. monitor symptomatic improvement
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
