Magnesium Sulfate	Anti-epileptic	CNS depressant	NA	Y  N	NA	-excessive diarrhea -dizziness -perianal irritation	1. do not give if knee jerk reflex suppressed 2. Monitor serum Mg 3. Teach pt s/s of Mg toxicity 4. use longer than five days = harm to fetus
Meperidine	Opioid agonist analgesic	Pain Relief	NA	Y  N	NA	-cardiac arrest -hypotension -respiratory depression - constipation	1. BBW: risk for addiction 2. start with lowest dose first 3. inform pt to report constipation 4. teach pt s/s of respiratory depression
Promethazine	Antiemetic	Nausea / vomiting	NA	Y  N	NA	-photosensitivity -agranulocytosis - neuroleptic malignant syndrome (NMS)	1. BBW: respiratory depression in pediatrics 2. teach pt to avoid long exposure to sunlight 3. Teach pt s/s of NMS 4. Teach pt s/s of agranulocytosis
Calcium Gluconate	Magnesium sulfate antagonist	Dietary supplement	NA	Y  N	NA	-constipation -hypotension - abnormal taste in mouth	1. Inform pt to report s/s of constipation 2. monitor mom and baby's cardiac response 3. inform pt it has a chalk taste 4. Inform pt to not take with any other drugs

Phytonadione	Vitamin K	Prevent bleeding	NA	Y N	NA	- cardiac arrest - metabolic acidosis - dyspnea	1. BBW: Severe reactions have occurred after administration including fatalities 2. inform pt to report any rashes 3. teach pt s/s of metabolic acidosis 4. Do not take if a previous rxn was observed
Erythromycin Ophthalmic Ointment	Antibiotic	Prophylactic treatment	NA	Y N	NA	-minor reactions -hypersensitivity to medication -redness/ irritation	1. Avoid contact with eyes 2. Do not take if a previous rxn was observed 3. Inform pt to report s/s of rash or redness 4. inform pt to report any vision changes
Engerix B	Vaccine	Prevent Hep B infection	NA	Y N	NA	-diarrhea -nausea -fatigue	1. review dosing schedule with the patient 2. inform pt to report s/s of prolonged diarrhea 3. Do not take if a previous rxn was observed 4. Syncope may occur
Hepatitis B Immune Globulin	Immune serum	Protection against Hep B	NA	Y N	NA	- decreased WBC count -headache -joint stiffness -n/v	1. inform pt to avoid live vaccines for 3 months 2. continuously monitor WBC count 3. may interfere with blood glucose reading 4. inform pt to report s/s of muscle stiffness
