Scenario 1: Seizure disorder

- 1) What priority problem did you identify for Jackson Weber?
ineffective breathing
- 2) What complications might Jackson Weber face if safety precautions are not taken during the seizure activity and if treatment is not implemented after the seizure?
airway obstruction, head trauma, broken bones, death
- 3) What key elements would you include in the handoff report for this patient? Consider the situation-background-assessment-recommendation (SBAR) format. Jackson Weber 5 year old male, admitted for epilepsy history of seizures, Patient on oxygen nasal canula 2L, O2 96, HR 110, BP 105/62, Pt reports no pain 0-10 FLAAC scale, Pt on seizure precautions, VS every 4 hrs, & neuro checks every 4 hrs. Call physician if seizures last longer than 3 minutes. Patient in bed watching tv, mom at bedside.
- 4) Reflecting on Jackson Weber's case, were there any actions you would do differently? If so, what were these actions, and why would you do them differently? No, I wouldn't have done nothing different.
- 5) Describe how you would apply the knowledge and skills you obtained in Jackson Weber's case to an actual patient care situation. With an actual patient I now know that airway is the priority, to have oxygen and suction ready for use, use seizure safety precautions, stay with patient after seizure
