Klor-Con (Potassium bicarbonate)	Potassium replacement	Treats or prevents low potassium (hypokalemia)	10 meq daily PO 0900			N/V Diarrhea Upset stomach Irregular heartbeats	1. Administer with food to prevent GI upset 2. Educate patient to drink with full glass of water 3. Monitor potassium levels to prevent Hyperkalemia 4. Report N/V
Atorvastatin (Lipitor)	HMG-CoA reductase inhibitors	Treats high cholesterol	20mg QHS PO			HA Rash Cramps Abdominal pain Diarrhea Constipation	1. Instruct patient to report unexplained muscle pain or tenderness 2. Monitor LFT's 3. Educate patient about dietary changes to reduce cholesterol 4. Monitor for GI upset
Terazosin (Hytrin)	Alpha-adrenergic blocking agent	Improve urination for BPH	5mg QHS PO			Mild dizziness Weakness Blurred vision Nausea HA	1. Monitor weight and report sudden weight gain accompanied by edema 2. Keep daily record of blood pressure 3. Instruct patient to change positions slowly
