May cause insomnia so take in morning 2. Avoid alcohol while on this medication 3. Take with juice to cover up bad taste in mouth 4. Reorient patient if confusion occurs |
| Acamprosate | Ethanol Dependency | Alcohol withdrawal | 666 mg po TID | Click here to enter text. | Click here to enter text. | Pruritus, diarrhea, flatulence, nausea, dizziness, depression | 1. Avoid activities requiring mental alertness 2. Drug will not eliminate or diminish symptoms of alcohol withdrawal 3. If relapse occurs, continue taking drug then notify HCP 4. Do not drink alcohol while taking this |

| Ibuprofen | Analgesic | Reduce pain | 200 mg po prn pain > 2 on 1-10 pain scale | Click here to enter text. | Click here to enter text. | Hypotension, rash, nausea, vomiting, dizziness | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Avoid use of additional NSAID's/aspirin 2. Avoid pregnancy 3. Drug may cause fluid retention 4. Take oral form with food or milk |
| ondansetron | Antiemetic | Reduce nausea/vomiting | 8 mg po or IV prn nausea | Click here to enter text. | Click here to enter text. | Constipation, diarrhea, headache, hypoxia, fatigue, malaise | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Avoid concomitant use of apomorphine 2. Report s/s of serious cardiac arrhythmias 3. Patient should not chew or swallow oral film 4. Instruct patient on how to take oral soluble films |
| lorazepam | Benzodiazepines | Reduce anxiety | 2- 4 mg IV or po prn CIWA-ar protocol | Click here to enter text. | Click here to enter text. | Asthenia, dizziness, sedated, depression | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Avoid activities requiring mental alertness 2. Avoid pregnancy 3. Do not suddenly discontinue this drug 4. Avoid alcohol while taking this drug |
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
