In July 1988, Rolando was convicted of theft. In August 1993, he was convicted of theft over \$200 but under \$750. He was then placed on probation for a year and had to serve community service. In April 2007 and August 2009, Rolando admitted he engaged in using cocaine and alcohol at an excessive level while caring for patients at Doctors Hospital at Renaissance where he was currently employed. In May of 2009, Rolando engaged in the intemperate use of cocaine and tested positive for cocaine while on call or duty. Rolando received a notice in the mail explaining when and where his hearing will be at and the time it starts. In the letter it states everything he must know by failing to appear to the hearing. Rolando failed to show up to the hearing which meant all allegations against him were true.

It was said he attended AA meetings regularly, had an AA sponsor, was seeing a licensed chemical dependency counselor once a week, and had a strong support system. I believe he was trying to change his habits but had a difficult time breaking those habits. I think the job he was working for should've tried to get him help or put him on a leave to get himself together. They should have been drug testing him regularly to make sure he still wasn't on any drugs while caring for patients.

I would have reported him right away and would have asked him to stop caring for the patients until he talked to a manager or higher up. If he was administering medication to patients I would have double checked all the patients he was caring for to make sure they were given the correct medicine or if they were given the wrong medication I would be sure they aren't having any reactions. I would also talk to the nurse and see what's going on or if there was anything I could do to help them stop doing drugs and or drinking alcohol frequently.
