Adverse Effects	Appropriate Nursing Assessment, Teaching, Interventions (Precautions/ Contraindications, Etc.)
<p>Heartburn, Nausea, GI bleed, GI inflammation, Tinnitus Cardiovascular Edema (Rare), Dizziness, Skin Rash</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li data-bbox="653 672 1792 848">1. Increased risk of cardiovascular thrombotic events (MI, Stroke), Contraindicated in patients with coronary artery bypass graft (CABG) because of increased risk of bleeding, so caution in patients with extensive cardiac history, monitor cardiac function closely.<li data-bbox="653 865 1798 991">2. Caution: 65 years old and greater/Pts with HX of peptic ulcer Disease &/or GI bleed because they are at greater risk for serous GI bleed, irritation, ulceration, and perforation (Beers Criteria)<li data-bbox="653 1072 1537 1110">3. Administer with food or milk to decrease GI distress<li data-bbox="653 1196 1707 1322">4. Caution in patients with Renal failure – nephrotoxicity can happen. Patients with Liver failure need to monitor liver function tests while on ibuprofen – hepatotoxicity can occur
