The two nurses were very helpful in showing me how they do things at the clinic.</p>	<p>Step 4 Analysis</p> <p>The only knowledge I could apply to this situation is my previous learning of skills and what I know about how to administer an injection. There were no issues or problems at the outpatient clinic. With the medication administration, I was able to learn more about antipsychotic drugs.</p>
<p>Step 2 Feelings</p> <p>As far as feelings go, I wasn't nervous about the outpatient clinic. I was excited to see what role the nurses played in this setting. The patients I had an interaction with when either drawing labs or giving an inject were friendly towards me. The nurses explained how the patients who come here are usually stable and are coming for their routine</p>	<p>Step 5 Conclusion</p> <p>In conclusion, the outpatient clinic was a good experience. I got to practice lab draws and injections which was a nice refresher. One thing that was nice to sit in on and experience was with the telehealth doctor out of Houston. I have never had any sort of experience with telehealth so it was neat to see in the real world. I learned a lot about the outpatient clinic.</p>
<p>Step 3 Evaluation</p> <p>Having clinicals here was a good experience to see how clinic nursing goes. I contributed by helping draw labs and give injections with the nurses present. I did not know what to expect coming in because I did not quite understand what the outpatient clinic was for. I realize now it is for patients who come to their routine appointments, to receive their medications, and to have lab work done.</p>	<p>Step 6 Action Plan</p> <p>Clinic nursing is very different than bedside nursing. Overall, it was beneficial to see how nursing care occurs in many ways. I think clinic nursing is something I would be interested in when I am wanting a more steady schedule. This experience taught me how patients needing behavioral health services go about getting treated. As far as professional practice, this experience showed nurses, even in clinic settings, are always assessing and providing education.</p>
