

Scenario 1: Seizure disorder

- 1) What priority problem did you identify for Jackson Weber?
 - a. Jackson was at risk for seizures. I needed to make sure he has seizure precautions and made sure nothing was in the way that could injure him during an episode. I also made sure his airway was not obstructed
- 2) What complications might Jackson Weber face if safety precautions are not taken during the seizure activity and if treatment is not implemented after the seizure?
 - a. Jackson could have been injured because he could have hit himself on the bed rails or rolled over onto something that should not have been in his bed during an episode.
- 3) What key elements would you include in the handoff report for this patient? Consider the situation-background-assessment-recommendation (SBAR) format.
 - a. The patient's name, allergies, age, and family at bedside. I would tell about how often the seizures happened and how long they happened for.
- 4) Reflecting on Jackson Weber's case, were there any actions you would do differently? If so, what were these actions, and why would you do them differently?
 - a. I would have tried to be a little more confident so that way I could be more prepared. I also would have checked the IV site when I walked into the room instead of waiting a little later.
- 5) Describe how you would apply the knowledge and skills you obtained in Jackson Weber's case to an actual patient care situation.
 - a. I would transfer the knowledge of being calm during the situation and making sure all precautions were in place. I would also transfer over some of the communication skills I learned (like how to talk to a child).
