At the time of the incidents, Ms. Linda Joyce Lee, was employed as a Travel Nurse with TaleMed Loveland, Ohio. During this time, she was assigned to Conroe Regional Medical Center in Conroe, Texas and had been on the job for two 2 months.

The first incident was during the time between January 8th - 28th 2013. When collecting Morphine, Hydrocodone, Hydromorphone, and Alprazolam from the Medication Dispensing System for her patents, Ms. Linda Joyce Lee failed to completely scan the medications into the system for each patient. By skipping this step, she could have resulted in medication errors such as administration the wrong medication. Furthermore, inadequately documenting medications to a patient's record can cause other care providers ,that solely rely on documentation and patient records, to potentially harm the patients resulting in over medicating.

The second occurrence was around January 31st 2013. As ordered by the physician, the patient was to take Droperidol, failing to scan the medication prior to administering Ms. Lee instead administered Haloperidol (Haldol). Thus, resulting in endangering the patient to an adverse reaction to the medication. Ms. Lee did state she correctly entered the order into the Medication Dispensing System to dispense Droperidol 5mg but failed to see that the machine had been incorrectly loaded with Haloperidol 5mg.

The safety and Security of the patient is always our priority for the patient. If Ms. Lee would have simply followed the 7 rights to administering medications this could have been prevented. By following all the steps in order, she would have scanned the medications, verified all the information, identified the patient, safely administered the medication, and then accurately and completely document all her patients' records. This would have prevented incomplete documentation and unnecessarily harm to a patient.

Accountability is the first word that comes to mind and not being silent would be the second. As a prudent nurse it is their duty to response to such situations. All nurses have a responsibility to assist those who are performing questionable actions. I would educate Ms. Lee about how important it is to follow the 7 rights to administering medication and how she should always follow these steps no matter what the circumstances maybe. By doing this she will constantly put the patient's health, wellbeing, and safety first. Thus, eliminating unnecessary errors that could potentially harm or possible cause death to her patient.

Furthermore, reminding her that a patient's chart is a legal document and a line of communication and information to not only to her fellow nurses, but other disciplines in the healthcare system as well. Patient documentation is essential that it provides the standard of care that the nurse is providing. Therefore, it is prudent to have clear and accurate documentation.
