Comments:

The following errors were made during my video:

1. I did not fully compare the doctors order to the pyxis when getting the medications at the very first of medication preparation. I should have held up my orders to the pyxis to ensure that they matched instead laying them down and looking back and forth. I compared the medication vials and syringes to the pyxis but this is still not per protocol. In the future I would ensure the hold my doctors order to the pyxis to do my second check for patient safety with medication administration.
2. I missed hand sanitizer when donning new gloves during medication administration because I touched the handrail. Hand sanitizer and hand hygiene is essential asepsis. I should have lowered the handrail prior to donning my first set of gloves.
3. I missed education and RR of the patient prior to connecting the morphine to the lumen. I stopped myself and did not push the medication, but it is essential to patient safety to get the respiratory rate before administering an opioid due to the side effect of respiratory depression.
4. I pulled the entire needle off accidentally when going to administer the TDAP shot. This could have contaminated the hub and therefore I should have gotten a new shot prepared and not pulled the needle off.

In the future I would get a new needle to prevent any infection or problems with patient safety.

5. I missed educating the patient about the care of the CVAD site. It is essential to the CVAD site that patients know to keep moisture away from it as much as possible, to notify the nurses if it painful, etc. The patient being educated on the care of the CVAD site so that the catheter does not migrate, or infection occurs. I would next time ensure that I educated my patient on this site to help ensure its integrity.
6. I should have worn a glove while cleaning the table for the sterile procedure. You wear these gloves to protect the patient through aseptic technique and prevent infection. In the future I will be mindful of wearing this set of gloves for prevent safety issues with the patient.
7. I touched the table after I cleaned it with my hands. I should have used my foot to move it and to avoid breaking the cleanliness of the table. In the future I will use my foot to move the table after it is clean.
8. I should have changed my gloves from the sterile gloves to clean gloves when beginning the assessment. I would do this to maintain asepsis and ensure the safety of my patient. In the future I would ensure doing hand sanitizer before donning my gloves and putting new gloves on for the assessment to ensure cleanliness.
9. I did not ask for consent to the vaccine prior to giving it to the patient. This is required by nurses prior to giving a vaccine for safety and the patient agreement to this vaccine. In the future I would ensure to ask for consent prior to giving this vaccine.
